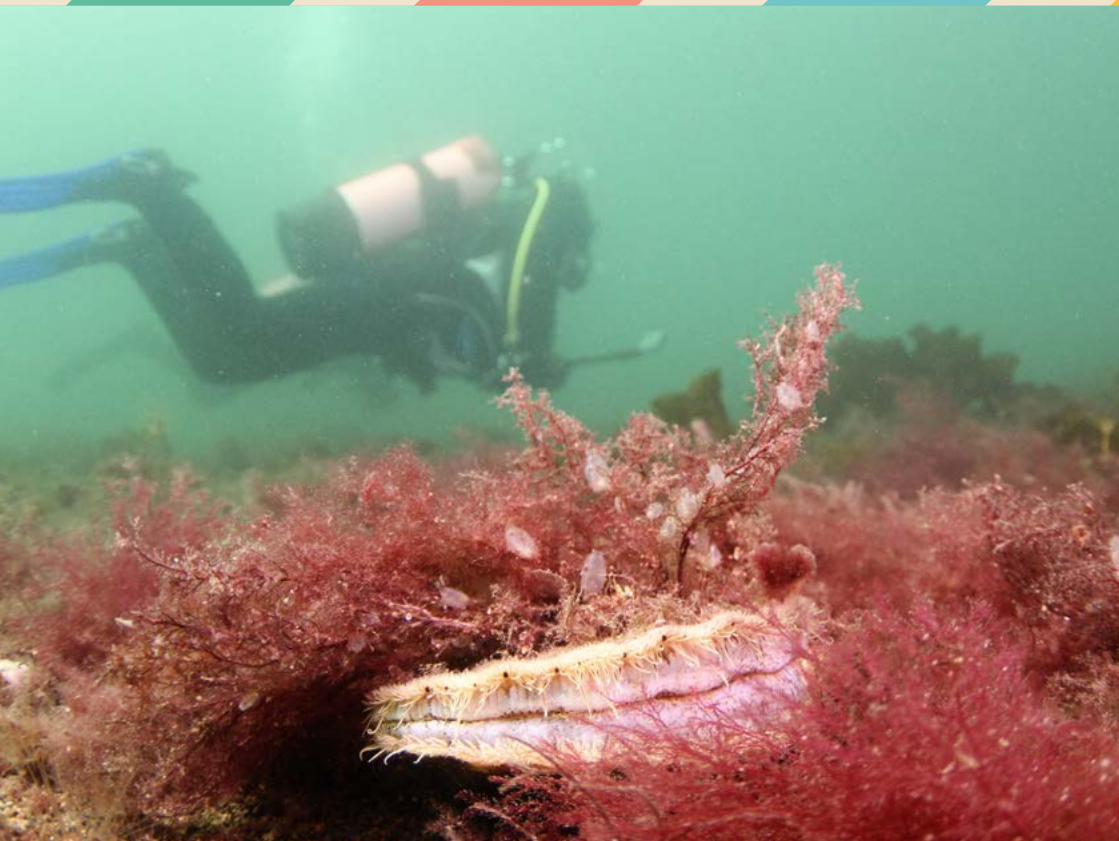

As **Dunoon Film Festival** returns for 2026, we hope you find lots to enjoy in this 12th edition of our celebration of film, designed to bring people together across our community to watch films, explore ideas, learn something new and have fun.
